The European Parliament and Council Regulation (EC) No 1406/2002<sup>1</sup> provides the legal basis for the establishment of the European Maritime Safety Agency (EMSA).

The goal of the Agency is to provide technical and scientific assistance to the European Commission and Member States on matters relating to the proper implementation of European Union legislation on maritime safety and pollution by ships. To do this, one of EMSA's tasks is to improve cooperation between Member States in all key areas. This includes undertaking a range of actions aimed at improving maritime safety.

In addition to its initial safety and pollution related work, in April 2004, EMSA was also given additional tasks by the European Council and the European Parliament related to oil pollution response, ship security and training of seafarers.

EMSA invites you to send your application for a Seconded National Expert as Assessor of Classification Societies. This position will be attached to Department B 'Implementation', Unit B.1. 'Safety Assessments and Inspections', Assessment of Classification Societies Sector.

#### **Functions and Duties:**

Under the responsibility of the Head of Unit B.1, Safety Assessments and Inspections and the Lead Assessor, the successful candidate will be responsible for:

- Participating in the managing and planning of the inspections to be carried out on classification societies;
- Carrying out the scheduled inspections including visits to ships;
- Reporting on findings of the inspections and proposing recommendations;
- Participating in the evaluation of the effectiveness of the inspection methodology;
- Participating in other tasks of the sector.

#### Main skills and qualifications:

- University degree or equivalent qualification or professional experience;
- At least five years of professional experience acquired after the award of the required qualification, of which three years must be in the area of the functions and duties.
  When no university degree or equivalent qualification has been acquired, nine years of experience is required, of which three must be relevant to the post;
- Good knowledge of the role and working methods of classification societies;
- Good knowledge of EU legislation and international conventions related to classification societies and ship safety;
- Good knowledge of international quality standards, such as EN ISO/IEC 17020:2004 and the ISO 9000 series;
- Excellent level of written and spoken English.
