
Following these changes, EMSA, in co-operation with the Members States, decided to update the 2007 version of the "Overview". Information about the Icelandic and Norwegian maritime administrations was also included. A web version of the "Overview of the 29 European maritime administrations" was created to facilitate regular and timely updates, which will be performed directly by the maritime administrations through the Consultative Network for Technical Assistance (CNTA) focal points.

The web version shows how the EU Member States and EEA Countries have organised their maritime administrations and, for each Member State, contains the following:

- Information on the Head of the maritime administration;
- Government body covering several areas of responsibility under the IMO and the ILO conventions;
- Government body covering several areas of responsibility under the European maritime safety legislation;
- Consistency of the fleet;
- Authorised recognised organisations;
- Statutory works delegated to recognised organisations;
- Number of flag State surveyors;
- Number of Port State Control Officers.




