The Agency also contributes to the overall efficiency of maritime traffic and maritime transport and supports European cooperation on coastguard functions.

EMSA invites you to send your application for a Seconded National Expert as an Assessor of Classification Societies. This position will be attached to Department B 'Safety and Standards', in Unit B.2 'Ship Safety' in the 'Classification Societies' Section.

The initial duration of the secondment is one year with possibility for extension.

The place of employment is Lisbon, Portugal.

Functions and Duties:

Under the responsibility of the Head of Unit B.2 'Ship Safety', and the sector leader of B.2.2 'Classification Societies', the successful candidate will be:

- Preparing inspection visits of Recognised Organisations (RO's);
- Carrying out inspections of ROs, including visits to ships and ship yards, globally;
- Reporting on the results of the inspection visits;
- Evaluating follow-up actions taken by ROs on findings resulting from the inspection visits;
- Participating in work related to the preparation of assessments of ROs for the Commission;
- Participating in the further development and improvement of the inspection methods and procedures;
- Monitoring the performance of the Recognised Organisations in general;
- Participating in other work related to the activities of the unit.

Main skills and qualifications:

- A university degree or equivalent qualification or professional experience;
- At least 3 years of professional experience, in the area of the above-mentioned functions and duties, acquired after the award of the required qualification. When no university degree or equivalent qualification has been acquired, 7 years of experience is required, of which at least 3 must be in the area of the above-mentioned functions and duties;
- Sea-going experience as navigating officer or marine engineer (or combined: maritime officer) or experience working as a naval architect for a ship owner, classification society, administration or ship yard;
- Good knowledge of the role and working methods of ROs;
- Good knowledge of relevant (European and International) maritime safety legislation and international and industry quality management standards;
- Very good skills in writing technical documentation in English;
- A high sense of responsibility and attention to detail;
- Knowledge of IMO and IACS will be considered advantageous;
- Being qualified as a Lead Auditor for ISO 9001 quality management systems standard will be considered advantageous.
