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## Chapter 1

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# 1. Themes and Tables

### INTRODUCTION

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This report provides a picture of the world's merchant fleet derived from data contained in the Equasis database. It looks at the make up of the fleet and its performance. The statistics are grouped into themes which could be of interest to the industry and regulators.

The themes are as follows:

1. The Fleet Population
2. Classification Societies
3. P&I
4. Port State Control
5. Vetting Programmes and Trade Associations

### 1.1. OVERVIEW

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Equasis is populated with most of the world's merchant ships. Basic particulars are derived from Lloyds Register Fairplay's commercial database (LRF). From a commercial and regulatory point of view size and type are two key criteria and therefore throughout this report the statistical analysis is based on these two elements.

### 1.2. SIZE

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By size ships are grouped into four categories: ) GT- (2)  $500 \leq GT < 25.000$  - (3)  $25.000 \leq GT < 60.000$  - (4) GT

1. Small ships  $< 500$  GT
2. Medium ships 500 GT to 25.000 GT
3. Large ships 25.000 GT to 60.000 GT
4. Very Large ships  $\geq 60.000$  GT

The small ships category reflects the main tonnage threshold for cargo ships to comply

with the SOLAS convention. This category also includes many ships which do not trade internationally and therefore are not covered by the conventions or the port State regimes. A significant proportion is also too small to be covered by classification societies and the vetting and trading organisations. They have therefore been excluded from most of the analysis in order to avoid distortion of the totals for ships which are generally covered by the conventions, the port State control regimes and the other organizations. Small ships are included in Chapter 1 and Chapter 2.1 to 2.3, to cover the whole fleet population, and in the multiple inspection figures in Chapter 5.1.

Regulatory and commercial tonnage thresholds are not common to all ship types. As a compromise, categories 2, 3 and 4 have been chosen so as to divide the fleet into three approximately equal parts in terms of tonnage. These three together represent the larger worldwide trading ships.

### 1.3. TYPE

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Equasis uses over 100 descriptions of ship type. For this report these types have been aggregated into 12 main types as follows:

- General Cargo Ships
- Specialized Cargo Ships
- Container Ships
- Ro-Ro Cargo Ships
- Bulk Carriers
- Oil And Chemical Tankers
- Gas Tankers
- Other Tankers
- Passenger Ships
- Offshore Vessels
- Service Ships

- Tugs

A table showing this aggregation is at Annex I.

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#### [1.4. FLAG](#)

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Flags (under which ships are registered) are grouped in two categories, "targeted" and "non-targeted". Those in the "targeted" group are the flags which appear on at least one of the targeted flag lists used in 2006 by the three port state control regimes which feed their inspection results to Equasis (Paris MoU, Tokyo MoU and USCG (safety targeting). These are recognised as the three most established regimes in operation.

The lists are published annually and reflect the safety performance of ships under each flag as measured by the number of port state inspections and detentions recorded over a three-year period.

It is possible for a flag to be "targeted" in one regime but not in another. This can be because its safety performance varies from one to another or because few, or none, of its ship trade to ports covered by the regime.

Further details are included in the list of the respective regimes' Port State Control Annual Reports for 2003, 2004 and 2005. A list of the flags is at Annex II.

## Chapter 2

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# 2. The World Fleet Population

### INTRODUCTION

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The tables in this chapter give a picture of the fleet of ships in Equasis in terms of type, size, age and the flag under which the ship is registered.

### RESULTS

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Graph 1 shows that by number the Equasis fleet is dominated (86%) by small and medium sized ships up to 25.000 GT. Small ships alone represent 36% by number, although only 1% by tonnage. Many of the small ships are not subject to international conventions on safety and pollution prevention because of their size or because they do not trade internationally.

General cargo ships are the most common type by number, at 26% of the Equasis fleet. However, most of these are small and medium-sized. In the large and very large fleets oil and chemical tankers and bulk carriers represent well over half of the fleet by number.

In terms of tonnage the large and very large categories represent 72% of the Equasis fleet (Graph 2), with oil and chemical tankers and bulk carriers dominating both categories at 61.9% and 69.6% respectively

Table 3 shows that over half (62.0%) of the Equasis fleet, by number, is 15 years or older but this is due largely to the dominance of older ships in the small and medium ship fleets. The trend is reversed for large and very large ships where 68.1% and 79.9%, respectively, are less than 15 years old. The large and very large ships dominate the most modern fleet with 86%,

by tonnage, of the fleet below 4 years old (Graph 4). At the other end of the age scale large and very large ships account for just 3% by number and 37% by tonnage of the Equasis fleet over 25 years old (Graphs 9&10).

Graph 11 shows that the Equasis fleet over 500 GT is equally divided, by number, between targeted and non-targeted flags (48% & 52%). But Tables 13 to 18 show that the proportion of ships under a targeted flag decreases with size – 51% for medium, 39% for large and 33% for very large ships. By tonnage the overall split is 40% targeted compared with 60% from non-targeted flags. Table 13 shows that general cargo ships have a greater share of the fleet under targeted flags (39.4%) than their share of the non-targeted flag fleet (19.7%). Conversely, passenger ships represent 4.4% of the targeted flag fleet but 8.6% of the non-targeted flag fleet.
























**Graph 12 - World fleet GT $\geq$ 500: gross tonnage of ships, by flag – 2006**










## Chapter 3

# 3. Classification Societies

### INTRODUCTION

Classification societies provide technical and surveying services for the shipping industry and undertake statutory surveys on behalf of flag states (as so-called “*recognized organizations*”). These services are mostly provided by societies belonging to the International Association of Classification Societies (IACS). There is no requirement under international conventions for a ship to be “in class”. However the vast majority of ships (and their flag state) rely on meeting the standards of class in order to comply with the construction standard required under the SOLAS and Loadlines conventions.

IACS consists of 10 member societies and one associate:

- American Bureau of Shipping (ABS)
- Bureau Veritas (BV)
- China Classification Society (CCS)
- Det Norske Veritas (DNV)
- Germanischer Lloyd (GL)
- Indian Register of Shipping (IRS)
- Korean Register of Shipping (KR)
- Lloyd's Register of Shipping (LR)
- Nippon Kaiji Kyokai (NK)
- Registro Italiano Navale (RINA)
- Russian Maritime Register of Shipping (RS)

The tables in this chapter show the proportion of the Equasis fleet GT $\geq$ 500, in each size and type category, which is classed with members of IACS and those classed with recognized organizations which are not members of IACS. Data on class is provided by IACS members and for non IACS recognized organizations the information is supplied by LRF when available.

There is also a proportion of ships which is either not classed or for which data is unavailable. These are shown as “Class not recorded”.

In chapter 3.3 the fleet is analysed according to class and flag status. Flags are grouped in two categories, targeted and non-targeted. Those in the “targeted” group are the flags which appear on at least one of the targeted flag lists used in 2006 in the port state control regimes of the Paris MoU, Tokyo MoU and USCG (safety targeting). These lists are published annually and reflect the safety performance of ships under each flag as measured by the number of port state inspections and detentions recorded over a three-year period. Further details are included in the list of the respective Port State Control Annual Reports for 2003, 2004 and 2005. A list of the flags is at Annex II.

In chapter 3.4 the detention rate of ships is the ratio between the number of detentions and the number of inspections in the Paris MoU, Tokyo MoU and USCG regions in 2006. All detentions are counted, whether or not the recognized organization has any responsibility towards the grounds for the detention.

### RESULTS

Graph 19 shows that the Equasis fleet over 500 GT is dominated by ships classed by IACS members (67% by number and 86% by tonnage). This proportion is reflected in most of the ship types although general cargo ships do show a smaller proportion than average covered by IACS (Table 21). Graphs 21 to 26 show that the IACS share increases with size, with 92% of the very

large fleet, by number and tonnage, covered by IACS. Ships known to be covered by non-IACS members are almost all medium sized (Tables 23-26) (Note: it is likely that some of the ships with class not recorded are in fact covered by a non-IACS society).

As Graphs 27,35,43 and 51 show the IACS' coverage is greater among the younger fleet and tends to diminishes with age – from 78% of ships aged up to 5 years to 43% of the fleet over 25 years old.

Graphs 59 and 67 show that the fleet of targeted flag ships has a lesser IACS coverage (56%) than the non-targeted fleet (72%).

The safety performance of the Equasis fleet over 500 GT, as measured by detention rates, shows that 4.4% of inspections resulted in detention in 2006. Those ships with an IACS class were less likely to be detained in 2006 (3.7%) than those with non-IACS members (13.3%) or with no class recorded (9.0%). This position was reflected across all ship sizes.





**Graph 20 - World fleet GT≥500 : gross tonnage of ships, by class – 2006**













**Graph 28 - World fleet GT≥500: gross tonnage of 0-4 years old of ships, by class - 2006**
















## Graph 52 - World fleet GT $\geq$ 500: gross tonnage of 25+ years old of ships, by class – 2006










**Graph 60 - Gross tonnage of targeted flag ships GT≥500, by class – 2006**






## Chapter 4

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# 4. P&I

### INTRODUCTION

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Protection and Indemnity (P&I) Clubs provide third-party insurance cover to ship owners. Members of the International Group of P&I Clubs (IGP&I) provide Equasis with information on all vessels entered in their clubs which are issued with IMO numbers. It should be noted that there is a significant number of small ships entered in International Group Clubs but as explained in Chapter 1.2 small ships are not included in the statistics which follow.

The following tables show the proportion of the fleet, in each size and type category, which is entered with those clubs (column headed IGP&I) compared to the proportion of ships which are either entered with a club which is not a member of the International Group or which are covered by commercial insurance for which information is unavailable or which are not covered by P&I insurance (column headed Non IGP&I).

In chapter 4.4 the fleet is analysed according to P&I and flag status. Flags are grouped in two categories, targeted and non-targeted. Those in the "targeted" group are the flags which appear on at least one of the targeted flag lists used in 2006 in the port state control regimes of the Paris MoU, Tokyo MoU and USCG (safety targeting). These lists are published annually and reflect the safety performance of ships under each flag as measured by the number of port state inspections and detentions recorded over a three-year period. Further details are included in the list of the respective Port State Control Annual Reports for 2003, 2004 and 2005. A list of the flags is at Annex II.

In chapter 4.5 the detention rate of ships is the ratio between the number of detentions and the number of inspections in the Paris MoU, Tokyo MoU and USCG regions in 2006.

### RESULTS

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Graph 75 indicates that 58% of the Equasis fleet over 500GT for which data has been supplied is covered by one of the members of the International Group. This rises to 88% by tonnage.

Within the large and very large fleet the vast majority (96%) is covered by the International Group. Within the medium fleet just under a half are entered in the Group clubs.

Comparing Graphs 83 with 91 reveals that the age profile of ships entered in Group clubs is considerably younger than those which are not. Nearly a quarter (24%) of the IGP&I fleet is under 5 years old and just one sixth (16%) is over 25 years old. Of the younger fleet, nearly a third is oil and chemical tankers (Table 89). This trend is more marked in the large and very large fleets. For non-IGP&I the comparable figures are 7% and 58%, with nearly a half of the older fleet being general cargo ships (Table 97).

Table 105 shows that more non-IGP&I ships are under targeted flags than under non-targeted flags whereas the reverse is true for the IGP&I fleet.

The safety performance of the Equasis fleet over 500 GT, as measured by detention rates, shows that 4.4% of inspections resulted in detention in 2006. Table 113 shows that ships outside the Group were more likely to be detained in 2006 than

those with inside the Group (10.5% compared with 2.7%). This position was reflected across all ship sizes.





**Graph 76 - Gross tonnage of ships GT≥500, by P&I status – 2006**













**Graph 84 - Gross tonnage of IGP&I world fleet GT≥500, by age – 2006**













**Graph 92 - Gross tonnage of non IGP&I world fleet GT≥500, by age – 2006**













**Graph 100 - Gross tonnage of ships GT≥500, by P&I status and flag – 2006**









## Chapter 5

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# 5. Port State Control

### INTRODUCTION

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Port State control authorities check the compliance with international conventions of foreign ships visiting their ports. Equasis includes inspection data provided by three of the regional port state control regimes, Paris MoU, Tokyo MoU and U.S. Coastguard (USCG).

### INSPECTION FREQUENCY

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A concern of the industry and regulators alike is that ships should not be subject to unnecessarily frequent inspections. The following tables show the level of annual inspections by the three regional port state control regimes which contributed to Equasis for the period 2001 to 2006.

### SHIPS WITHOUT INSPECTION RECORD

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Ships are subject to port State control inspections in most parts of the world but Equasis receives data only from three PSC regimes. Some ships do not trade to these three regimes or in some cases have not been inspected when they have visited them. In addition, some ships are not eligible for PSC inspections either because of their size or type or they are only engaged on domestic trade, but these are mainly confined to small ships. Therefore there is a portion of the eligible fleet without a port state control inspection record in Equasis.

A significant portion of this "without inspection record" fleet, particularly very large, large and medium ships could, potentially, be trading in the waters of these

PSC regimes or commence trading to their ports. The inspection figures show the proportion of the fleet which have not been inspected by one of the three PSC regimes IN THE LAST 3 YEARS (2004 to 2006). The figures are sorted by type and age ranges; type and flag; type and class status; type and P&I coverage.

### RESULTS

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Table 117 reveals that of 44450 ships in the Equasis fleet over 500GT 60% (26654) were inspected at least once in the period 2004-2006 and over 82% by tonnage. Table 119 shows that the number of individual ships inspected has risen steadily in the period 2001 to 2006.

The frequency of inspection of ships has remained fairly constant with around a third of inspected ships inspected once and a third inspected twice in each year. Graph 109 shows that the number of ships inspected more than twice in a year dropped in 2006 after steadily rising over the previous five years.

Regionally Table 120 and Graph 110 indicate that in 2006 there was a greater tendency towards multiple inspection of ships in the Tokyo MoU region than in the USCG region, with the Paris MoU region somewhere in between.

A comparison of Tables 119 and 121 shows that of the 23849 individual ships inspected in at least one of the regions, 1481 (6.2%) were inspected at least once in all three regions during 2006. 8439 (35.4%) were inspected in two regions. The remaining 58.4% of the ships was inspected in only one of the regions.

Graph 112 shows that the vast majority (94%) of ships without an inspection record are in the medium-sized category. A comparison of Tables 1 and 122 shows that of the 34794 medium-sized ships 16691 (48%) have no record in 2006. Graph 132 indicates that for these ships the rate of those with no record was lower for targeted flag ships than for non-targeted flags (20% compared with 28%). For large and very large ships the proportion of ships without an inspection record falls to 10% and 15% respectively – the rates are similar for both targeted and non-targeted flagged ships.

By age, just over half (51%) of ships without a record were over 25 years old (Graph 114). Similarly by class, a half has no class recorded, while just 8% of ships with no record were recorded as classed by non-IACS members (Graph 122).
















**Graph 115 - Gross tonnage of ships GT≥500 without inspection record, by age – 2004/2006**











**Graph 123 - Gross tonnage of ships GT $\geq$ 500 without inspection record, by class – 2004/2006**











**Graph 131 - Gross tonnage of ships GT $\geq$ 500 without inspection record, by flag – 2004/2006**








### **Graph 135 - Gross tonnage of large ships without inspection record, by flag – 2004/2006**








**Graph 139 - Gross tonnage of ships GT≥500 without inspection record, by IGP&I – 2004/2006**











## Chapter 6

# 6. Trade associations and Industry Vetting Programmes

### INTRODUCTION

Several professional maritime trade associations and industry vetting programs supply information to Equasis on ships covered by their schemes; such schemes are either company based or ship based. The company based schemes (e.g. Intertanko) relate to certain ships types and aim to provide a mark of quality for ships covered by them. The ship based schemes (e.g. OCIMF) provide industry inspection reports.

For each relevant ship type and size category the tables in Chapter 6.1 show the proportion of the fleet covered by each of the schemes which provide information to Equasis.

The ships types covered by each body are as follows:

#### Trade Associations

1. Intertanko	Oil & chemical tankers Gas carriers
2. Intercargo	Bulk carriers General cargo ships
3. Green Awards	Oil & chemical tankers

#### Industry Vetting Programmes

4. CDI	Oil & chemical tankers Gas carriers
5. OCIMF	Oil & chemical tankers Gas carriers

The tables in Chapter 6.2 show the detention rates of ships covered by each of

the schemes compared with ships of the same type which are outside the relevant scheme.

#### Shipping Companies

For each ship Equasis records the company which provides the operational management either;

- a) under third-party contract, or
- b) managing ships owned by itself or its associated companies.

In most cases the company is the one responsible for the operation of the ship and the duties and responsibilities imposed by the International Safety Management Code (ISM Code). The Code applies to passenger ships and other ships of 500 GT or more, trading internationally.

Just over 1000 ships do not have a company recorded and are counted as belonging to a unique company. The real figure for one-ship companies in Table 164 is therefore likely to be lower.

The tables in Chapter 6.3 show the make up of the fleet of ships in Equasis according to company fleet size, as measured by the number of ships over 100GT they operate. The tables also show the detention rates of ships over 500GT in each fleet size category.

The detention rate is the ratio between the number of detentions and the number of inspections in the Paris MOU, Tokyo MOU and USCG regions in 2006.

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## RESULTS

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Table 156 indicates that a majority of relevant ships are not covered by the trade associations and industry vetting programs providing data to Equasis. However, of the large and very large oil, chemical and gas tankers just over a half (1583 out of 3070) are covered by Intertanko while nearly 90% are covered by OCIMF (2727 out of 3070). OCIMF also covers around 40% of medium-sized oil, chemical and gas tankers (2741 out of 6751).

Tables 159 to 161 suggest that medium, large and very large ships covered by one of the trade associations and industry vetting programs are inspected more frequently in the three regimes providing data to Equasis than those ships not covered – for example, large ships covered by Intertanko were each inspected on average 1.65 times (1642 inspections of 993 ships) compared with 1.17 times (1014 inspection of 868) for the relevant ship types not covered by Intertanko.

Table 158 indicates that ships covered by a trade associations or industry vetting program were detained less often than those not covered. For example the detention rate of inspected ships covered by Intercargo was 1.7% compared with 6.0% for the relevant ships types not covered. There is a similar picture for ships covered by Intertanko, Green Award, CDI and OCIMF. This trend is more or less repeated over all ship sizes and among the very large fleet just 8 detentions (0.4%) resulted from the 2028 inspections of ships covered (Table 161).

Table 162 shows that just under a half (48.7%) of companies operate just one ship. Over 80% operate five or fewer, although these companies account for 34.5% of the fleet over 500GT by number. The table also shows that companies with more than 10 ships have smaller proportion of their ships under targeted flags than the average for the whole fleet – in the case of companies with more than 100 ships the proportion is 24.1% compared with the average of 48.1%.

Table 163 reveals that ships operated by larger companies had a much lower detention rate than those operated by smaller companies. For ships in companies with more than 50 ships the detention rate was around 2% while one- and two-ship companies had rates of 11.96% and 9.52% respectively.






**Graph 146 - Total number of companies and ships GT≥500, by fleet size – 2006**
