Objet : Emergency response Covid-19

Extending the validity of STCW and STCW-F certificates, documentary evidences for seafarers, and, marine medical certificates for seafarers, during the state of health emergency aimed at curbing the spread of the Covid-19 virus.

1. Context

France was again declared in a state of health emergency from October 17, 2020. The law has set the end of this state of health emergency on June 1, 2021 inclusive. However, specific measures still apply or are reintroduced in the functioning of State services and companies, which may continue to affect the issuing or the revalidation of STCW and STCW-F certificates, training documentary evidences and marine medical certificates for seafarers, which would expire during the period.

Thus, the following provisions are necessary for transport and maritime services to keep going. They consist for the services of the French Maritime Authorities in extending the validity of the various seafarers' certificates or documents essential for the operation and which cannot be issued or revalidated because of the circumstances related to COVID 19.

These measures are taken in consistency with the international provisions recommended and decided by the IMO and the ILO on the matter.

2. Provisions for STCW and STCW-F certificates, documentary evidences for seafarers issued by French maritime authorities

In compliance with Government measures to fight against the spread of the COVID-19 virus, and in order to allow seafarers and ships to keep going their activities, the period of validity of the following documents, expiring from March 12, 2020, is extended from this expiration date, up to the end of the state of health emergency set by the aforementioned law of November 14, 2020 nowadays set for June 1, 2021 :

- STCW and STCW-F certificates of competency and certificates of proficiency ;
- Documentary evidences of a training approved ;

Seafarers will not have to make a request to the administration, as this extension is ipso jure, not entailing the issue of a new document.

The French maritime authority may reduce this extension depending on the resumption of activity of the administration, training centers, before this deadline.

3. Provisions for medical certificates issued to seafarers by French maritime authorities

In compliance with Government measures to fight against the spread of the COVID-19 virus, validity of medical certificates for seafarers essential for ships operations, expiring from March 12, 2020, is extended from this expiration date, up the end of the state of health emergency set by the aforementioned law of November 14, 2020 nowadays set for June 1, 2021.

Seafarers will not have to make a request to the administration as this extension is ipso jure, not entailing the issue of a new document.

The French maritime authority may reduce this extension depending on the resumption of activity of the administration, seafarers' doctors, before this deadline.
