## MONTE ARUCAS SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETES ACCEPTANCE TEST



Monte Arucas oil response equipment put into action

The Monte Arucas tanker has joined EMSA's network of standby-oil spill response vessels after passing the acceptance test held in Ferrol, Spain on 3-4 July. The vessel owned by Sertosa Norte and operated by Naviera Urbasa brings an additional 2,940m<sup>3</sup> of storage capacity to the network as well as state-of-the-art oil recovery equipment, including a high capacity skimmer, ocean oil boom, rigid sweeping arms and oil slick detection system. The Monte Arucas, stationed in Ferrol, will provide pollution response to the Bay of Biscay, where maritime traffic is heavy, particularly on the route that runs from the English Channel to the strait of Gibraltar.

#### COOPERATION TO ENHANCE BLUEFIN TUNA CAMPAIGN

EMSA and the European Fisheries Control Agency (EFCA) continue to join efforts to improve maritime awareness for fishery control campaigns. The bluefin tuna campaign in the Mediterranean Sea (15 May-31 July) benefited from enhanced behaviour monitoring capabilities through EMSA's Integrated Maritime Data Environment service (IMDatE). This gives EFCA the ability to closely monitor fishing activities in dedicated areas (see fig 1). Additionally, optical images were used to successfully complement the monitoring data (see fig 2). On 15 July, a new campaign started in the North Sea where the challenge is to detect fishery activities in a high density shipping area. The monitoring service provides a realtime maritime picture enabling EFCA and fishery inspectors to interpret maritime activities, in particular illegal fishery activities. Several national authorities are supporting this interagency cooperation by granting access to all available vessel information sources (VMS, LRIT, etc).
