Sessions:



ISM training




Aim:

The course was to ensure that participants are familiar with the ISM Code, including internal audits, and develop a practical approach to the interpretation and application of the ISM Code particularly in the context of port State Control inspections.

Target group:

The participants were flag and port state control officers from the 10 Member States that acceded the European Union on 1st May 2004.



Training programme

- Evolution of management systems standards and the ISM Code Requirements and implications of the ISM Code relating to safety and pollution prevention at sea;
- Relationship of the ISM Code to the existing international legislation, including European legal instruments;
- Operating management systems and their role in demonstrating compliance with the ISM Code (including requirements of an effective maritime safety management system);
- Types of audit;
- Audit planning and use of checklists;
- Practical audit performance and its evaluation (including writing audit reports and non-conformity statements);
- Documents of compliance and safety management certificates relating to vessel certification and company) under the ISM Code;
- The application of the ISM Code during port state control inspections

ISPS training



Aim:

The course shall ensure that participants are provided both with a combined knowledge on the main elements of ISPS, auditing procedures and develop a practical approach to the interpretation and application of the ISPS Code.

Target group:

The participants will be officers from the Member States administrations involved in the monitoring and control of compliance of security measures on board ships, companies and port facilities.

ISPS training



Training programme

- The ISPS Code: general introduction of the Code and related background information, the role and responsibility of security personnel, integrating the ISPS Code and related international and national legislation, importance of the ISPS Code in the supply chain and the concept of the intermodal security policy, Company Security Officer, Ship Security Officer, Ship Security Assessment, Ship Security Plan, Port Facility Security Officer, Port Facility Security Assessment, Port Facility Security Plan, Recognized Security Organization, Declaration of Security, verification and certification for ship, security levels, drills and exercises, sanctions, training requirements,
- Auditing issues: auditing and inspection in relation to ISPS Code, types of audit, audit planning and use of checklists, control and compliance measures.
