Purpose/topic:	Procurement procedure No. EMSA OP/05/2015 for the supply of specialised oil pollution response equipment

- At the beginning of the meeting EMSA welcomed the participants. It was highlighted in particular that as
 result of the conclusion of this open procedure, EMSA would purchase new equipment in view of setting
 up a new service aiming at offering stand-alone specialised oil pollution response equipment. The
 separate procurement procedure (EMSA/NEG/08/2015) to contract EMSA's Equipment Assistance
 Service (EAS) was launched on 21 April 2015 and was published on the EMSA's website under the
 procurement section.
- 2. The following presentations were delivered by EMSA during the meeting:

a) Objective, type of procedure and tender criteria

The presentation provided an overview on the objectives, the scope, and the specific requirements applicable to the open procedure. Besides, it was provided a description of the tender criteria (Exclusion, Selection and Award criteria) to be fulfilled in order to submit an admissible tender. The compliance with all the exclusion and selection criteria was highlighted as essential for admitting a tender to the evaluation phase.

b) Overview of the equipment and submission of a tender

This presentation introduced the different types of equipment separated into the seven lots, and focussed on how to present the technical and the financial offer by filling in the relevant Annex. The key elements for submitting a tender were pointed out (such as relevant information to be completed in the grey part of the Annex, provision of equipment manuals and inclusion of other ancillaries).

c) Framework Contract and its implementation

This presentation provided an overview of the main legal and financial elements in relation with the framework contract. As for the implementation of the framework contract, the elements to be defined in

the specific contract were in particular stressed out (such as quantity of the technical components, time and place of delivery, definition of the total price and provision of ancillary services).
